Dear Parents

What a fantastic end to an incredibly busy term! Along with following our usual packed curriculum, children have been busy this week getting ready for Christmas and enjoying the celebrations, lunches, discos, shows and parties that have taken place across all year groups.

On Monday, Year 2 celebrated the end of their geography topic by holding an 'Explorer Day'. Each child came dressed as an explorer of their choice, and spent much of the day investigating explorer vehicles and had a wonderful time designing their own. Thanks to

parents for their support with costumes, especially during such a busy time of year.

On Monday evening, 16 children performed at Eton College Chapel, as part of the Slough Schools' Christmas Carol Service, and what a performance it was! As one grandparent rightly described it, even though our choir was the smallest in number, they 'punched above their weight'! The children, along with Mrs Green, have rehearsed diligently and should feel really proud of what they achieved: the service had a wonderful atmosphere, with the audience thoroughly entertained from start to finish. Well done choir!



Also on Monday, EYFS held their Christmas Party Day, and much fun was had by all! Spirits were high, as the children enjoyed party games and other Christmas activities. On Tuesday, Years 1-6 enjoyed their own party day, dressed in Christmas jumpers and party clothes. They had a lovely time in classes with their teachers, playing party games and crafting, and then ended the day with a disco in the hall. They also enjoyed a special in-person visit from Santa, who delivered presents to each class. It was a lovely opportunity for the children to let their hair down and enjoy themselves, having worked so hard all term.

Some of you may have been following Simon Cowell's new boy band, December 10, and TV show on Netflix, The Next Act. If you have older children who previously attended Holy Family, you may well have recognised Nicholas Alves, a former pupil here, who is now a member of the band! Nicholas is now 16, and would have been in Year 12 currently.

Following their successful trip to the RAF Battle of Britain Bunker in Uxbridge, Year 6 ended our term in style by performing the WWII Christmas Show. The show showed Geoff and Toby, two 10-year-old boys, and their families, and what life was like during the Blitz campaign over Christmas in 1940. The Year 6 children performed with professionalism, and managed to share important messages about the real meaning of Christmas, along with a large dose of singing, dancing and fun! Thank you to parents for helping with costumes and props, and for coming to watch on Thursday evening in such large numbers.

When we return in the new term, children in Key Stage 2 will be encouraged to take part in our 'Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move' chaplaincy initiative, which has run successfully for the past couple of years. Children will have the opportunity to run an extra-curricular club of their choosing for a series of 4 weeks – they will need to spot a gap in our current offer and design a programme that they can lead and manage. The club they run will align itself to one or more aspect of Catholic Social Teaching and/or a school virtue. On Saturday 20th December, we have a number of Key Stage 2 children taking part in an athletics competition at Thames Valley Athletics Centre, and we wish them the very best of luck as they compete against local athletics clubs. 
Attendance

Reception Supplementary Forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office.
