Dear Parents and Carers

School was a lovely place to be this week, finished off by a beautifully sunny Friday! We have spent time talking to the children about the Catholic Social Teaching principle of being a peacemaker, and we have seen this in action in classrooms and on the playground; children have shown kindness and been problem-solvers when friendship issues or disagreements have arisen. So much 'soft' learning takes place outside of the curriculum as children learn to live with one another and navigate social situations, and it has been a pleasure to watch them as they learn and develop the skills that will help them and the rest of the world which can, at times, feel less than peaceful!

On Thursday of this week, school welcomed Mark McLaughin, the newly-appointed CEO of St Thomas' Catholic Academy Trust, who visited us for lunchtime. Children were incredibly welcoming and friendly, as they approached to engage with him; he left feeling special as so many children — even Nursery aged children — came over for a chat. He commented particularly on how happy everyone seemed, children and adults alike.

Also on Thursday we welcomed many parents into school for our annual 'Meet the Teacher' meetings. Those parents who were able to attend were given an overview of the year ahead, and had the opportunity to hear from their child's class teachers about expectations and other key information. Thanks to so many parents for coming along.

Today we welcomed Danielle Mercer, from the Slough Early Years Team, who came to visit our Nurseries. She was impressed to see how our new provision for 2 year olds has been organised, and how engaged our youngest children were with their carefully selected resources. Our 3-year-old provision was, as always, calm and well-ordered, full of happy children. It makes us really proud to showcase our Early Years provision and the team who run it so effectively.

Mrs Hume ran two very well-attended phonics meetings for EYFS and KS1 parents on Tuesday – one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Feedback from parents was that the information was helpful and will enable them to feel more confident when helping their child with reading at home. These sessions will be repeated in February for anyone who was unable to attend or anyone who would appreciate a 'top-up'.

We have an increasing number of children in school who have allergies, and we ask all parents to be extra mindful when sending food into school for any reason. For birthdays, for example, some parents choose to send treats in for their child to share with their classmates. We request please, that this be limited to a small packet of sweets, rather than cakes, biscuits or chocolate. While the offer is always well-intentioned, it can lead to children feeling left out or, even worse, put them in danger of an allergic reaction. We must ensure that we are minimising risk and prioritising the safety of our children.

Some members of our Local Academy Committee have recently left the board due to increasing time commitment; we would like to thank Roisin Holden, Ruth Serrano, Huw Williams and Sukvinder Sur for their service and dedication to our school over recent years. Due to these changes, we are currently looking to recruit a new member to our Local Academy Committee (previously known as the Governing Body). In particular, we would love to appoint somebody who has a background in finance. Please contact the school office if you are interested; we would really appreciate your help.

Many of our Year 6 children will be sitting their Slough 11+ this weekend; we wish them luck; I am sure there will be a huge sigh of relief when it's over!

We look forward to raising money for Macmillan next Friday when all children will enjoy a cake. We welcome donations of cake items – please read further in this newsletter for more information. (I understand this contradicts the above request regarding birthday treats, this event will be managed carefully by school staff who are aware of children's allergies.)


Achievements

Nursery and School Admission for September 2026

Admission to Reception September 2026

The above admission round opens on the 15th of September 2025 and closes on 15th January 2026. You must apply via your local authority website completing a Common Application Form (CAF) for a place in a Reception class to start September 2026.

In addition to completing a CAF, please complete our Supplementary Form (Called 'Reception School Supplementary Form' on our website) and return with the relevant supporting

documents to Holy Family Catholic School by 15th January 2026. Reception Supplementary Forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office.

Admission to 2 or 3 Year Old Nurseries September 2026

The Nursery 2026 admission round is now open. Nursery application forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office; please complete our Application Form and return with the relevant supporting documents by 15th January 2026.

Flu Immunisation for Children in Reception - Year 6

The date currently scheduled for your child to receive the flu immunisation in school is 7th November 2025. An online consent form from the NHS Berkshire Immunisation Team will be emailed to parents of children in Reception-Year 6 over the next few days. Consent needs to be given before 9am on 6th November 2025. Please see the letter you will be emailed for further information and details regarding how to give your consent. Thank you.
