Dear Parents and Carers

This morning, Miss Macfarlane's Year 2 class led the first class assembly of the year. It was an absolute joy! Children spoke confidently, timing was perfect, they all looked proud of themselves and Alfie Worthington lit up the room with his beaming smile! As ever, the learning and guidance shared was inspirational. The Learning Characteristic **Hope**, reminding us to hope with certainty that our God has a good plan for each of us was cleverly interwoven with the Catholic Social Teaching Principle of **Care For Creation** and the Catholic Virtue of **RESPECT** for God's world. It is clear to see how teachers are combining the elements of our 'Strong Foundations Pupil Passport' into their RE curriculum. Well done Mrs Macfarlane and Year 2. Thank you to all the parents who supported and celebrated with your children this morning. Your children love to see you in school.

Year 4 had a great time visiting Kew Gardens on Tuesday. They had a good look around the greenhouses, learning lots about the different layers of the rainforest, and the entire ecosystem. Children enjoyed finding out about what foods and other things are grown in the rainforest and were amazed to learn that we use so many of them in our everyday lives. Thank you to our staff and volunteering parents who looked after our children so well for the day.

On Wednesday, a group of ten children visited RDA in Fulmer, for a day of horse riding and pony care. They enjoyed brushing the ponies and oiling their hooves, as well as playing games and eventually riding some larger horses. The children were fantastic representatives of our school, and the accompanying staff members were especially proud of them and their behaviour.

We have really felt the value and importance of parental support more than ever this week.

- At our first Local Academy Committee meeting of the year school leaders were delighted to welcome two new Parent Governors: Christina Mahboob (mum Elsa, Elena and Eden) and Ravinder Singh (dad of Adikrit). - When a parent we expected to accompany Year 4 to Kew was unable to attend at short notice, via the parent WhatApp group, a substitute was found. In total 6 parents gave up a whole day to facilitate this trip which teachers really appreciated.
- Today, 15 Year 6 children have travelled by coach to Dunstable to be commissioned as our Mission Team. We were struggling to release 2 members of staff and requested a parent volunteer to attend along with Mrs Henriquez (TA); we were delighted mum of Jacob Remmer came forward.
- Two classes (Miss Iqbal's Y3 and Mrs Green/Mrs Evans Y4), both visited Langley Library this week. Without the army of parental support these valuable local trips could not go ahead.

Although I have always known the importance of parents working in partnership with school staff, with the difficult financial situation schools find themselves working in, we are increasingly relying on you. Thank you all for your incredible generosity with your time. It is very much appreciated.

Achievements


Congratulations to Jovan Sur for passing his Stage 3 swimming lessons and gaining confidence in swimming in the deep end. Well done Jovan.

Calling all Altar Servers

Flu Immunisation for Children in Reception - Year 6

The date currently scheduled for your child to receive the flu immunisation in school is 7th November 2025. Adventure Playground

Please ensure that children are not climbing on the adventure playground at the end of the school day, or at any time when a member of school staff is not supervising. We are not insured unless a member of staff is present and we ask you to support us by keeping your children away from the equipment whilst waiting for older siblings to come out of classes at the end of the day. Thank you.

Unauthorised Absence Reminder

We would like to remind you of school's expectations regarding attendance and unauthorised absence, and attached to this newsletter you will find a document outlining our approach. As a reminder: holidays will not be authorised, and days off school attached to either side of school holidays will also be recorded as unauthorised, unless medical evidence can be provided.

Collection from after-school activities

When collecting your child from their after-school activities, please be advised that, if the activity takes place outside on the field/ playground, children will be brought to the gate outside the main reception entrance and released to a parent there. Please can parents refrain from walking around past the nursery gate (which needs to be left open for after-school club and external users) and onto the playground. This makes for a smoother handover, as we often have children who attend Bradley tuition arriving at this time too. We appreciate your support in prioritising the safely of our children.

Nursery and School Admission for September 2026

Admission to Reception September 2026

The above admission round opened on the 15th of September 2025 and closes on 15th January 2026. You must apply via your local authority website completing a Common Application Form (CAF) for a place in a Reception class to start September 2026.

In addition to completing a CAF, please complete our Supplementary Form (Called 'Reception School Supplementary Form' on our website) and return with the relevant supporting documents to Holy Family Catholic School by 15th January 2026. Reception Supplementary Forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office.

Admission to 2 or 3-Year-Old Nurseries September 2026

The Nursery 2026 admission round is now open. Nursery application forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office; please complete our Application Form and return with the relevant supporting documents by 15th January 2026.
