Dear Parents and Carers,

Our school community have come back to school following an extended half term; I hope you felt the benefit of a longer break and children are refreshed and ready to engage in their learning for the next six weeks — it will fly by!

We ended another calm and focused week in school with Mrs Fox's Year 5 class liturgy. Thank you to the large number of parents who were able to come along and share the beautiful reflection that the children shared with us. Year 5 created a wonderful calm atmosphere — which isn't always easy in a school hall full of almost 500 wriggling bodies! They presented the audience with all they have learnt about All Souls Day, as well as giving us the opportunity to remember and be thankful for the times spent with loved ones who we have lost. We were reminded that, despite our sadness, our loved ones are being looked after by God and are waiting for us. Thank you to Year 5 children and the adult team.

This weekend, we mark Remembrance Sunday across the country. Well done to those children who will be taking part in parades or marking this occasion within their communities. Thank you to Mrs Fox and the school council for arranging the selling of poppies and other Remembrance items in our playground before and after school each day. Before half term, we asked for any altar servers within school to nominate themselves to take on a larger role in our collective worship. I am delighted to announce that Daniel Brumby (Year 5), Bryan Rodrigues (Year 4) and Clara Chipuriro (Year 4) have volunteered, with Daniel taking the lead role. We look forward to working with them, and thank them for being brave in putting themselves forward.

Another thank you to all those Key Stage 2 children who completed the half term creative homework last week, where they were asked to design a liturgy that they could lead in their classrooms. The first few have happened this week, and have been absolutely wonderful to be part of! Everyone else who has designed a liturgy will get to lead theirs too, over the coming weeks and months.

Thank you to Maria Teresa Kiran (Year 3) who responded to our plea for more crucifixes by donating two; these were much-needed and will be hung in school.

Our children all came into school yesterday looking wonderfully smart for their annual school photographs; you will receive more information on how to order them shortly, as well as a proof of the photos taken. Today, children were very brave when meeting the school nurse team, who came to give immunisations to any child whose parent had signed up.

On Monday of next week (10th November), we encourage all children to wear odd socks to school along with their usual school uniform. This is an initiative led by the Anti-Bullying

Alliance, and marks the beginning of anti-bullying week in schools across the country. The theme this year is Power for Good, and is an opportunity for children to further consider the importance of inclusivity and individuality.


Attendance

The above admission round opened on the 15th of September 2025 and closes on 15th January 2026. You must apply via your local authority website completing a Common Application Form (CAF) for a place in a Reception class to start September 2026.

In addition to completing a CAF, please complete our Supplementary Form (Called 'Reception School Supplementary Form' on our website) and return with the relevant supporting documents to Holy Family Catholic School by 15th January 2026. Reception Supplementary Forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office.

Admission to 2 or 3-Year-Old Nurseries September 2026

Eligibility for a Free School Meal – Information for Parents

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
