Dear Parents and Carers

Well done to Mrs Powell's Year 2 class for a beautiful 'Celebration of the Word' this morning. Hope and resilience featured a great deal in their messaging. Children shared the Learning Character Optimism with us and reminded us that, although we all experience life's struggles, we are called and chosen by God to be Prophets of Hope. Children explained spreading hope is as simple as caring for God's creatures, being helpful at home and looking after their environment. The whole school sung a rousing version of the Jubilee Song of Hope which raised the roof! Thank you to Year 2 for making us all smile this morning.

Year 3 look amazing in their Greek costumes. The highlight of their day was tasting olives, grapes, feta cheese and honey. They learnt about gods and goddesses as well as creating name cards using the Greek alphabet.

Earlier in the week, many children came to school wearing odd socks to mark Anti-Bullying Week. There's a serious message behind the odd socks. Wearing odd socks represents the fact we are all unique and different, and that everyone will be happier if we are kind to each other and respect each other's individuality.

Thank you to all the parents who joined their Nursery or Reception children for 'Stay and Play' sessions. Sessions were really well attended and parents were very engaged in play with children, taking care to include children whose parents were not at the session. Nursery children loved showing their parents around, reading with them and some parents even enjoyed the playdough activity.

This week, our youngest children, 2-year-olds, have been learning about different forms of transport. They have been acting out 'The Wheels on the Bus' and made a bus with shapes.

Some classes have already held their Remembrance Worship with many children expressing mixed emotions. Sadness because loved ones have passed yet at the same time feeling calm and peaceful because they know their loved ones are happy in heaven, their eternal resting place. If any children still have leaves at home, please remind them to return them to school. Our Remembrance Tree is slowly transforming as more coloured leaves are added with each class worship.

Next week, we look forward to welcoming all parents to our only compulsory Parents' Evening of the year. Today, you should have received allocated appointments from class teachers. Please contact class teachers on Monday if you do not yet have an appointment.

Over the next few weeks we will be introducing Playleaders to the playground at lunchtimes. This is a trial scheme where some Year 6 children will be leading and teaching the younger children traditional and new playground games.

We invite all our families to join school staff at the 11.30am Feast of Christ The King Holy Family Parish Mass on Sunday 23rd November, also known as Youth Sunday. Current school staff will welcome you and present you with a commemorative Holy Family Catholic School enamel badge, and refreshments will be provided after Mass. 

In addition to completing a CAF, please complete our Supplementary Form (Called 'Reception School Supplementary Form' on our website) and return with the relevant supporting documents to Holy Family Catholic School by 15th January 2026. Reception Supplementary Forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office.
