Dear Parents and Carers

We have had a lovely week in school, with children and staff settled back into routines; school is calm and focused. The wet weather has meant that children have been kept inside for a number of their break times but, despite this, behaviour has been positive and staff have worked hard to ensure that children have the much-needed movement time so we didn't go stir crazy!

Many year groups have started new topics this term, and are enjoying their learning. Year 3 have enjoyed learning about Tutankhamun, particularly because he was only eight years old when he became a king, and they could imagine themselves in that position. Year 6 spent this afternoon with the paints and screen printers, with some of them completing their Banksy-style designs.

### **Attendance**


