Dear Parents and Carers

There has been much excitement – and some minor disruption – caused by our new building starting this week! Ground works have begun, which has meant that we have had to ask staff and families to make some adjustments to the way that they arrive and leave school each day. Next week, there will be a pause in the build, so we should be able to move more freely; after that, restrictions will be in place for a number of weeks to ensure everyone can be kept safe – thanks in advance for your patience and flexibility as we create a welcoming and more appropriate space for our youngest children.

On Monday, school was closed to children, and all staff met to work on preparation for upcoming inspections, as we are due visits from both Ofsted and CSI (Catholic Schools Inspectorate). Staff worked on familiarising themselves with changing frameworks, to ensure we feel as ready as possible to show inspectors the great things that happen here every day.

As part of our day, staff also welcomed Fr Tony, who led us in a reflective liturgy, reminding staff of the importance of the work they do, not only with children's academics but also in their lives, helping children and families to lessen their burdens in one way or another. Fr Tony also spoke to staff about the Parish Mission, which runs from 23rd-27th February. Our parish is delighted to welcome Fr Elias Gweme and Fr Royston Price, who will work with parishioners in helping to deepen faith and search for greater meaning in life. You will find the leaflet explaining more about the mission attached to this newsletter, and we join Fr Tony in encouraging you all to come along and take part.

There is increasing excitement in school this week as groups of Key Stage 2 children prepare to launch their child-led 'Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move' clubs. These clubs are an introduction to children in leadership and designing and seeing through a project. The children who don't lead clubs this term will have an array of clubs on offer to choose to attend in break and lunch times, which they will hear all about in assemblies next week. If your child is running a club, please encourage and support them to plan well and come prepared to present their ideas to the rest of the school. Thank you.

This week children in Key Stage 2 have been considering how they can be stewards of God's creation by preparing for Eco Council elections. Mrs Powell met with the newly-appointed team at lunchtime today, where they shared why they had put themselves forward to be an Eco Council rep and what ideas they had for future projects. The Eco Council will meet weekly going forward. Thanks to all children who were brave enough to stand for election, and a big well done to those who were elected – we look forward to hearing what you have planned.

Celebrate Success!

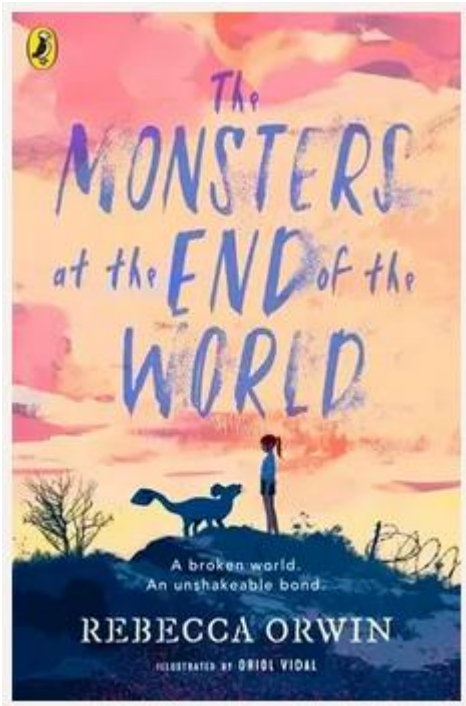
