Dear Parents and Carers

Today began with a beautiful Class Assembly throughout which Mrs O'Reilly's Year 5 class shone very brightly. Wearing a uniform of blue jeans and white t-shirts they presented a theatre-worthy performance. Sharing their learning about the Beatitudes, Year 5 reminded us we are all children of God living in his love and mercy. They repeatedly made the point that happiness does not come from 'having more, but from loving more.' Children reinforced this by sharing the Beatitudes, singing a song about the churches social teaching and acting out what this looks like on our playground. Thank you to all the parents who celebrated with Year 5 and we hope you felt as proud of your children as staff did.

'Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move' pupil-led clubs started well this week. Many children were very organised with equipment and had recruited friends to join them. There has been much laughter with various sports and dance clubs taking place in the hall and some more peaceful activities taking place in classrooms and shared areas. Eco Club, Board Games and Make Friends and Colour were all very calm and enjoyable. Thank you to all the staff who are helping to resource and supervise clubs at break and lunch time and the kitchen staff who are welcoming everyone who is arriving late for lunch.

I would like to recognise the contribution of three Year 6 girls who hugely support staff during wet lunchtimes. Skye Fenton, Sophie Loughman, Leyla Eiffert are incredible helpers. These young people convey messages around school often calling classes to the dining hall. They lead dance activities in the hall for up to 120 children with far more energy than any staff could. These girls show initiative, confidence and maturity beyond their years. Well done girls; I would employ you in a heartbeat!

We are pleased the new building is progressing without too much disruption to our normal routines. We aim to give parents advance notice should we need to close the path to the Nursery but please give us grace if we forget. Please observe cones across the pavement indicate a short notice closure.

Attendance

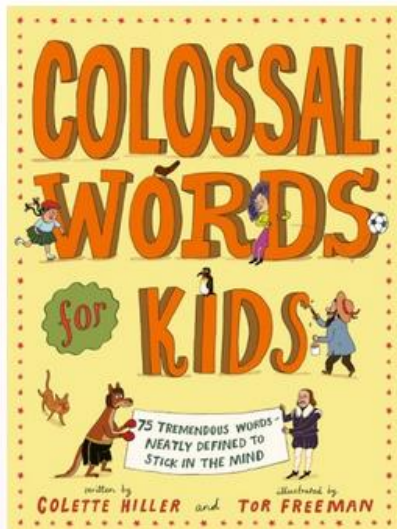

Daily School Lunches – Years 3–6
