Dear Parents and Carers

We have enjoyed a busy week at the end of a cold and rainy half term. Today, I walked into a cloakroom to hear a Year 3 boy say, 'Finally, it's the last day of half term!' After more wet playtimes than we are used to I think staff and children are all ready for half term.

This week, children have reflected on safe internet use and the whole school has been reminded of the importance of verifying information and telling a **'trusted adult'** should they see or hear anything online that doesn't feel right.

Our three-year-old Nursery children loved having parents/grandparents join them for their 'Stay & Play' session. Nearly everyone had a visitor and they do love to see you in school so thank you for making time to visit their classroom.

Year 2 had a wonderful China Day! The children designed, made and evaluated puppets inspired by the Chinese zodiac animals. They enjoyed tasting a variety of Chinese foods for lunch such as spring rolls, egg fried rice and noodles which they described as 'yummy'. They were also delighted to welcome Ms Kaur (Amreen's mum), who introduced them to the Erhu, a Chinese two stringed instrument. Everyone looked fantastic in their red and Chinese-inspired outfits - thank you to parents for your support!

Thank you to everyone who came to visit Year 1's Dinosaur Exhibition yesterday afternoon. The children were very excited to share everything they have been learning about during the last few weeks. This was a lovely end to their Dinosaur Day.

Miss Macfarlane has set the whole school a half term challenge linked to World Book Day, Thursday 5th March. Children are encouraged to read in an unusual, surprising, or imaginative place over the half term and send a photograph to the link provided by the 4th March. We hope your children enjoy the challenge.

Thank you so much to all our families who sent in the empty chocolate tubs – 300 in total! All tubs collected will be taken to a plastic reprocessing centre where they're shredded, before being sold onto plastic manufacturers to use in place of new plastics. All money raised from the sale of plastic tubs will be given directly to Macmillan Cancer Support. 2025 saw over 240,000 tubs collected nationally raising £10,916 for Macmillan Cancer Support. With your donations, we are hopeful that Holy Family will have helped to beat that record for 2026!

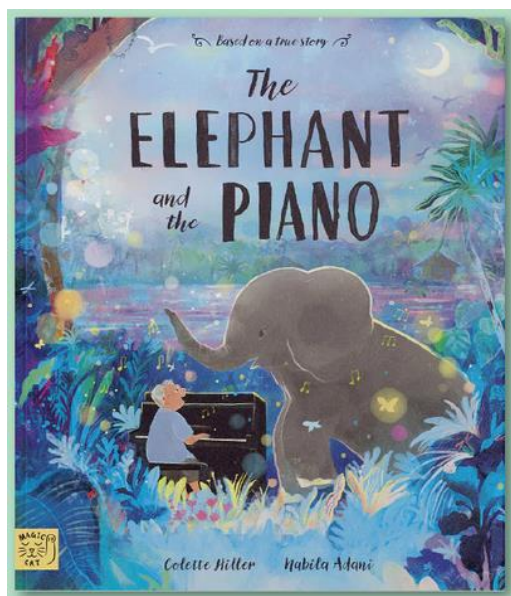
Safer Internet Day

World Book Day – Thursday 5th March

World Book Day is always a lively event in school; the theme this year is 'Reading for Fun'. Children usually enjoy coming into school dressed up as a favourite book character – there are plenty of simple ideas online for dress up without the need to spend money on a shop-bought costume; a simple prop depicting a character is enough. Children will spend the day engaged in a variety of activities based on a Waterstone's Child's Laureate. The work that is produced by the children will be displayed in classroom windows or doors. We invite you to enjoy the author trail after school by walking around the outside of the school building looking at classroom windows/doors, celebrating the work that the children have produced on World Book Day.

We will also have the Book Fair in school for the week of World Book Day. All children will be issued with a voucher which entitles them to £1 off their chosen book. The book fair is open to parents and children before and after school and is a fantastic way to browse some books and raise money for books for our school too. The book fair is now cashless, and can be paid for by using our card reader (contactless options available – Apple Pay or Google Pay) or through our online QR code.
