### **Dear Parents and Carers**

We have had yet another busy week in school, with lots of lovely things happening for our children. The children have enjoyed taking time to reflect on the season of Lent in different ways during the week; many year groups have participated in the Big Lent Walk, visiting various reflection points that have been dotted around the school. Years 3 and 4 have, today, come to school wearing their pyjamas in order to raise money for CAFOD, the global charity that we support as a school. Other year groups will complete their fundraising activities next week.

On Tuesday, Year 4 celebrated Roman Day – it was delightful to see the children coming into school with some fabulous outfits and/or accessories. Thanks to parents for supporting us in our curriculum days – they mean so much to the children, help embed learning and create lasting memories.

On Wednesday, our girls' football team took part in a tournament at Marish School and left us all feeling proud of how much they have improved as a team. Many of the girls involved are new to football and most don't play outside school, yet they continue to turn up each week to training and give it all their effort during the games that are organised for them. Well done girls – keep up the good work!

Also on Wednesday, Year 6 visited Langley Free Church to take part in their annual programme, Easter Cracked. Here they learned about the true meaning of Easter, and had time to reflect and celebrate this most special time in the liturgical calendar. It is a great opportunity to link with other denominations within the Christian Church and engage with the wider community.

There have also been gymnastics displays happening in school this week, and we were delighted to see so many parents coming to watch their children show their newly-learnt skills; I hope you feel proud of the progress they are making.

Today we had a number of mothers and grandmothers visit our Nursery as part of a Mother's Day celebration. Your children are always delighted to see you in school, so thank you very much for attending where work and other commitments allow it. ## **Pilgrims of Hope**

As you may be aware, Catholic schools have been asked by Pope Francis to take part in the Jubilee 2025 celebrations, an opportunity to reset, renew our faith and commit to building a fairer world where all people may flourish; the children have thoroughly enjoyed what we have done so far. Along with our Lenten Walk, the children have been fundraising in a variety of ways this week, and will continue to do so next week too. We are raising money for CAFOD during the period of Lent, and any donation from families would be very welcome – as we are a cashless school, please make any donation – however small – via ParentPay. Next week, our Holy Door arrives in school, which will be decorated to mark this important year. We will be asking the children to get creative over the Easter holiday to design and make some art work that will help create a display to go alongside our door – more information to follow.

Also next week, we welcome Josh and Azleen, parents of Zyana in Year 3, to work with our Year 6 children in an 'anti fast fashion' workshop. This generous offer from them ties in perfectly with our school community's bid to reduce, recycle and reuse what we already have, rather than buying new. We are excited to see the creations that our children are inspired to design and make, all with things they already own or can share with one another. Year 6 children have been sent home today with a letter to further explain this to their parents.

## Two-year-old Provision

We were aiming to have our application process shared with parents by Easter, although this is now looking unlikely. Plans for the two-year-old provision are going well and without major difficulty, but there has been a slight delay in getting approval from the Department for Education. We fully expect to have approval granted in good time to get all applications processed, but we cannot go ahead in taking applicants without a formal approval. We will write to parents as soon as permission is granted and the application process can begin. Thank you for your patience.

## Social Media, Adolescence and Misogynistic Culture

You may have seen much reported in the press this week regarding the Netflix show Adolescence and, leading on from this, an increase in discussion around the use of smartphones and social media by our young people. We have noticed a sharp decline in Year 6 children bringing phones to school, which is fantastic for us, but are also regularly dealing with issues that happen via phones between our children in the evenings and weekends. We urge you please to check your child's phone on a regular basis to ensure they are kept safe. When issues about phone use are brought to our attention, we act in line with our school behaviour policy: children are reminded that foul and inappropriate language are unacceptable, as is taking and sharing photos of other children and/or staff without their knowledge and consent. Please reiterate these messages at home so that our children begin to understand the impact their online behaviour can have on those around them.

Attached to this newsletter you will find some information regarding the rise in 'incel' culture and how young people can be best supported when navigating what they see online. As part of the Richard Dimbleby lectures, Gareth Southgate (former England men's football manager) speaks knowledgably and eloquently about the crisis facing our young people, and boys in particular, due to their access to social media and outside influences. ## **Studybugs - New System for Reporting Absences**

Following a successful trial of the Studybugs absence reporting app with Year 6, we will be rolling this out across school for all pupils from April 2025. This app is used to report absences to school. We will be asking all parents and carers to download the app and use this instead of emailing or calling school to report absences. A letter with further information/instructions will be sent home with children next week.

## **Multiplication Tables**

Year 4 parents may already know that there will be a Multiplication Tables Check for all Year 4 children in June. There will be 25 questions of mixed times tables up to  $12 \times 12$ . All schools will be taking part in the check each year as it is now part of the standard testing for schools.

All Key Stage 2 children should be practising their times tables weekly as part of their homework and can use Times Tables Rockstars to do so. This is especially important for Years 3 and 4. We recommend using <a href="https://www.timestables.co.uk/multiplication-tables-check/">https://www.timestables.co.uk/multiplication-tables-check/</a> as it is similar to how the Times Tables Check will look. Please encourage your children to practise regularly.

### **Phonics**
