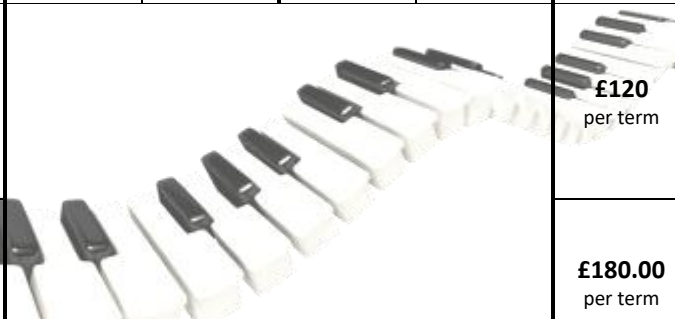

How lessons are offered

Lessons are offered in groups of up to 7 pupils in a lesson, or individually (one-to-one). These are lessons with a specialist music teacher who will tailor the lesson specifically to your child's needs and aspirations so they can make the best possible progress. Lessons are offered in school, during the school day, but are subject to the agreement of the headteacher. We do not offer lessons in individuals' homes.

Why should you use Slough Music Service teachers?

Slough Music Service is part of Slough Borough Council's People - Children department and is subsidised by Arts Council England. This means we are subject to rigorous service and safety standards, receive funding to help keep lesson fees as low as possible, and are accountable to government for the quality of our teaching.

All our staff are subject to regular enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks and safeguarding training, as well as being monitored under our quality assurance procedures. They also receive regular training to update and enhance their skills.

What else we can offer...after school music clubs and holiday activities

We offer weekly after school music centres for FREE, where pupils who are having lessons can come and play with others in our orchestras, bands and choirs. We also run Music Technology clubs, as well as Early Ears after school clubs.

We run our Holiday and Food programme, during the Summer, Easter, and Christmas holidays as well as other special projects where children can take part in a range of musical activities. Please visit our website or contact us for more information.

Instruments - hire or buy your own.

Your child will need an instrument to learn. We suggest hiring an instrument from us when you first start lessons. Once you know you are really committed to playing the instrument (2 or 3 terms) you might like to buy your own. We can offer instrument hire, subject to availability, for a small charge. Please ask us for advice before buying your own instrument as we can help you to buy an instrument without VAT, meaning you save 20%.
