
Thank you, Lord, for this Friday and the blessings of the week. Guide my steps this weekend and fill me with your peace.

Two-Year-Old Nursery Provision

We are now receiving applications for our 2-year-old provision which opens in September 2025. So far, we have completed two rounds of allocations. We will allocate on a weekly basis until we are full.

Are you eligible for 15 hours funded 2-year-old childcare?

In England, there are three government-funded early education schemes that offer free childcare for children aged two, three and four:

- 15 hours free education and childcare for 2-year-olds (families on certain low-income benefits or children with additional needs)
- 15 hours free childcare for all 3 and 4-year-olds (universal entitlement)
- 15/30 hours free childcare for eligible children between 9-months to 4 years-old (working parents)

Each of the free childcare schemes has different eligibility rules so it's important to check which of the schemes is right for you. Please look at the Terms and Conditions documents on our website for the links to check eligibility.

Relationships Education Nursery – Year 3

Next week, during science lessons, the children from Nursery to Year 3 will be learning about Relationships Education. This covers three strands Created and Loved by God, Created to Love Others and Created to Live in Community. The content of each lesson is guided by the Ten:Ten teaching resources Live Life to the Full Plus. Life to the Full is a Relationships and Health

Education (RHE) curriculum programme underpinned by a Christian faith understanding that our deepest identity is as a child of God – created, chosen and loved by God.

On Monday 23rd June, Year 6 will be attending a retreat day at St Bernard's Grammar School. We will be walking from Holy Family to St Bernard's, arriving for a 10am start. We are thrilled to announce that some members of our school choir will be taking part in a very special event at *The Hexagon* in Reading on Monday 23rd June 2025.



Living Streets - WOW Programme Launch



School Council introduced the WOW – walking to school - programme in years 2 to 5 this week. WOW is a pupil-led initiative where, at school, children self-report how they get to school each week using WOW Travel Tracker. If they travel sustainably at least once a week for a month, they are rewarded with a WOW badge. It's that easy!

WOW schools see 59% fewer car journeys to the school gates and 18% more journeys walking and wheeling all the way to school. WOW also promotes healthy mental wellbeing by improving behaviour and concentration levels in class.

If you usually drive to school, you can 'park and stride' i.e. park a 10-minute walk away and this counts as walking to school on the WOW programme. You can also cycle or scooter. So get those walking shoes ready and WOW your way to the school gates until the end of term! Thank you, Mrs Fox.

Hot weather

All children, but especially our younger children, should bring a sun hat to school daily. Sun cream should be applied in the mornings before school.

Sports Davs

All children have been given a letter stating which colour team they will be in for their forthcoming Sports Day. If children happen to have a T-shirt in the colour specified at the top of the letter they bring home, please can they wear that colour top on their respective Sports Days. However, please do not go to the expense of buying any new tops — usual PE kit is absolutely fine. Also, after dropping children to school, please can parents wait outside the school premises until 9.20am (when the main gate by the school car park will be open) on their child's Sports Day. Thank you.

Internet Safety

Are your children safe online and accessing appropriate content?

Over the last couple of weeks, staff have dealt with a few incidents where children have accessed inappropriate content from devices at home. We will be speaking to the children in school regarding what is appropriate and what is not but it is important that the messaging is consistent from families also. With the exponential rise in online content, it is important that we take our role in protecting children and educating them seriously; this means proactively

limiting access and monitoring the content viewed and shared by our children. To support with this, we would strongly advise watching the short Internet Matters video linked below and reading the Youtube guide that is attached to this newsletter.
