## **Year 5 Trip to Longridge Activity Centre**

On Tuesday this week, Year 5 went to Longridge Activity Centre in Marlow for their school trip. Despite it being the hottest day of the year so far, the children had the most amazing time and did not let the heat stop them from getting totally engrossed in a range of exciting water sports and land-based activities. The day started with team challenges where they had to work together to solve puzzles and problems. After that, they moved to the climbing wall and Jacob's Ladder, and the day finished with Dragon boating on the River Thames around the nearby lake. It was truly wonderful to see the children cheering each other on and the sight and sound of children chanting 'heave ho' as they paddled their boats down the river was simply joyous! ## **Emotional & Physical Safety**

Staff at Holy Family understand that keeping our children safe is our number one priority. As such, we would like to share some information with you, and ask for your support. We ask that, should any problems arise between your child and another, that you approach your child's class teacher in the first instance. Please do not address another child in the playground or outside school to sort out any difficulties.

Children who are cycling to school must be wearing a bicycle helmet at all times. Parents are responsible for ensuring that bikes and scooters are roadworthy; please check the brakes. We also ask that parents support us in ensuring children are not riding bikes or scooters on the school site at all. This is to avoid accidents, as our school site can be a very busy place.

When cycling on the slip road, please make your children aware that pedestrians will not always hear their bell or move aside even if they do hear it. We would like to avoid accidents wherever possible, so please be aware of how to cycle safely and ensure your children are aware of their own responsibility as a cyclist.

Finally, please remember the slip road is not pedestrianised and neighbours still drive up and down during the period when parents are restricted from entering in cars. Families must be road aware at all times. Thank you for your support.

## Safeguarding Audit

This week, school was subject to a safeguarding audit by the Leader for Inclusion at St Thomas Catholic Academy Trust, Michelle Chappell. Michelle spent the day looking at policies and procedures, as well as speaking to staff and children. She was very pleased with what we have in place to keep our children safe. One observation she had that we can look to improve is that our children are not always forthcoming in describing the ways they can keep themselves safe and sharing messages regarding safety. We will continue to work on this during assemblies and in classrooms so they can better articulate what they know.

## **Summer Reading Challenge**



To mark the 150th anniversary of the St Bernard's Chapel, Holy Family's Faith Ambassadors were invited to take part in a special visit as part of the school's "Past, Present, and Future" celebrations.

During the visit, we explored the chapel's rich history and took time to reflect on its evolving role as a place of worship and community. We also took part in a session on stained-glass windows, learning about their artistic and spiritual significance in places of worship across time. Inspired by the chapel's stunning windows and our own faith journey, we returned to school to create original artwork.

The piece on display here depicts our thoughtful response to our visit – in particular to the newest stained glass window in the chapel – designed around the St Bernard's school emblem.

We decided to 'deconstruct' our school badge to represent the spirit and identity of Holy Family School. You will see the hand of God is central to our window – God will guide us in our faith, our education, our home and our future.

## **Two-Year-Old Nursery Provision**

We are now receiving applications for our 2-year-old provision which opens in September 2025. We will allocate on a weekly basis until we are full.

## Are you eligible for 15 hours funded 2-year-old childcare?

In England, there are three government-funded early education schemes that offer free childcare for children aged two, three and four:

• 15 hours free education and childcare for 2-year-olds (families on certain low-income benefits or children with additional needs)

- 15 hours free childcare for all 3 and 4-year-olds (universal entitlement)
- 15/30 hours free childcare for eligible children between 9-months to 4 years-old (working parents)

Each of the free childcare schemes has different eligibility rules so it's important to check which of the schemes is right for you. Please look at the Terms and Conditions documents on our website for the links to check eligibility.
